This team has been packing in the fans and is an exciting team to watch play. Where does Rylan stand on the Career Point leaders

list you ask? Well, the number 1 career point leader for Lynbrook is David Mascia 2077 (1987-1991), followed by Kevin

McMahon 1585 (1988-1992), James Dombrowski 1077 (1991-1995), Steve Kaufman 1036 (1982-1985), James Parisi 1031 (1990-1993)

then Rylan Blondo with 1000 and counting. Keep in mind that the three point field goal was instituted in high school basketball

The results are in. The two LHS girl's who were among the finalists in the Science Contest were NOT selected for the final 40 candidates.

They still deserve a lot of pats on the back for a job well done.

While I was in graduate school (University of North Carolina) I wrote a paper on the topic as to "Why do left-handed pitchers have

difficulty in throwing strikes?" Seems that if a pitcher threw lefty and did everything else right handed he fell into that category of
