The latest salary report has been announced for Long Island School District Superintendents. These salary numbers include the benefits (medical insurance, life insurance and other perks plus the annual base salary).

Leading off at #1 is the Rockville Center District (Southside) at \$458, 386

- 2. Freeport \$436,781
- 3. Jericho \$435,683
- 4. Locust Valley \$427,023

Down at #33 is Lynbrook, Melissa Burak at \$334,545. The LHS Superintendent has four more years to her contract and plans to retire at the end of that contract. Her pension will be approximately 75% of her final five years average salary.

Further down at #74 is Malverne at \$294, 558.

And the Lynbrook residents keep on passing the school budget with no regard to the high salaries paid to the Administrators. Last year all Administrators were given an approximate \$20,000 pay raise while the teachers received 0.02 raise. Some of these administrators have never been in the classroom as a teacher.

Some of you WOO members have been emailing me asking "Where have you been? Is everything OK?" Seems my WOO messages about the Village and School District news gets read with interest so here are some tidbits about the local area's news, Village and School District.

On the School side of things the football team has a 2-3 record and is presently in fourth place in their 8 team League with the top four teams making the Play-offs. They are rather weak this season but still compete but with not much success against the better teams.

The Girls Volleyball team (there is no Boys team) is once again playing superb Volleyball and is fighting for first place and will certainly make their Play-offs come early-mid November. The Girls swimming team is once again hitting the water with a superb season and is presently fighting for first place and will certainly make their League Play-offs and may even have one or two swimmers qualify for the NYS championships. Time will tell.

The Boys Soccer team is presently right at .500 and is having a rough time losing games by close 1-0, 2-1 scores. The Girls Soccer team is rather young this year and is below .500 and it looks like they are just playing out the season calling this a "rebuilding" year.

The Girls tennis team is in first place and have only one loss and have an excellent chance of winning their League Championship. With only a few matches remaining they are primed for a great season. The Girls badminton team is slightly above .500 and has a good chance of making their League playoffs.

Fall sports all officially start with try-outs November 18.

On the Village side of news the Capri Motel is once again appearing before the Village Board next week to discuss their SALE to a builder who plans to build two story condos, or rental apartments, which ever the Board approves, and has officially purchased the Capri but the Capri owners would like to discuss a longer waiting period before any removal takes place as the Motel is still open and operating. That change of hands will certainly take place in another month or so if the Board knows what they are doing.

Many pot holed roads in the Village have been repaved by the Village and County and Broadway is finally getting repaved after years of neglect. The new LIRR station remodeling/construction is still on hold as the LIRR has other projects to complete before Lynbrook gets it's starting time. There will be new waiting rooms on the platforms, a bigger ticket office area, additional escalators and some reinforcements to the columns holding up the tracks. That should take a year or so as it is done in sections.

There have been no major traffic or disturbance problems with the new movie , the Regal, that replaced the old Century Theater as we once attended. The Astoria bank, across the street from the police station, has been sold and the 2-3 floor offices have already been relocated while the Sterling Bank, on the main floor, has a few more months before locating elsewhere. What will take place there is anybody's guess.

St Johns Lutheran Church, located across the street from the Police Station and up the road from OLP, has merged with another Lutheran Church from and is now named St. John-Incarnation Lutheran Church. Attendance has increased and activities are well attended.

That's it for now my WOO friends. I can remember when I was taking a writing course with Margaret Hecker back in 1957. I volunteered to cover the high school sports. She came up to me after one class and said (I may paraphrase somewhat), "Donald, she always called me Donald, you should stay with writing somehow in your graduating years as you have a unique skill and your articles are well written and interesting." In Nassau County alone the monthly income to live comfortably is \$11, 702

Taxes average for Nassau is \$2,387 a month. That comes to an average of \$28,644

I personally pay half of that amount with a Star Discount and a Veterans Discount with a Cap Cod style home, not a Hewlett Harbour multi-million dollar and more home.

The lowest location for a comfortable living income is Bronxville, Texas where the yearly combined income for that same family of four is \$58,906

I am not ready to move to Texas.

Now you may wonder why there are currently 68, yes 68, homes for sale in the Village of Lynbrook. Young couples and retirees are leaving Long Island do to low incomes. Florida and NC here they come!

I sure hope you have had a better month than we have had!

Marja had broke her second hip on 9/17, she was transferred from Lovelace Hospital to

Bear Canyon rehab facility on 9/24. On the 29th she was sent back to Lovelace Hospital then back to

Bear Canyon on the same day. She was at Bear Canyon until 10/11 when she was sent home to continue

her rehab with in-home help from Ambercare personal. The Ambercare people showed up on 10/12 and

discussed their plans for rehab. That afternoon I heated a Burette for Marja and took it to her in bed. A while

later I checked on Marja and found her laying on her back on the bed with her legs dangling off the bed, her

walker upside down with her food on the floor. I asked her if she had fallen and she said she didn't know

what happened. Her speech was mumbled, I couldn't understand her so called the doctor that had just visited

with her. After talking to her the doctor told me to call 911 and get her to a hospital. She was having a stroke.

She was taken to UNM Hospital on 10/12 and remains there 'til this date. Hopefully she will be returned to

Bear Canyon which is only a couple of blocks from our home (and they allow our puppy Crystal to visit her)

She has lost the use of her right side of her body (Arm, Leg, and Face) and still has trouble speaking.
